

**NOTIFICATION OF AQUATIC TREATMENT  
WEBSTER LAKE, WEBSTER MA**

Selected Areas of Webster Lake, including the mouth of Sucker Brook Cove and the southern end of Lower Cedar Cove will be chemically treated with the USEPA/MA registered aquatic herbicide Sonar (fluridone) on Tuesday June 13<sup>th</sup> to control nuisance and invasive aquatic vegetation. In addition to the restrictions imposed from the larger scale treatment occurring on the same day, the lake water from these specific areas cannot be used for irrigation of newly seeded turf/plants or plants/flowers from the Solanaceae Family (including tomatoes, peppers, tobacco) for a period of 90 days commencing on June 13<sup>th</sup>. This irrigation restriction does not apply to established turf, trees and shrubs. A map of the lake showing the affected coves is available on the Webster Lake Association's website ([www.websterlakeassociation.org](http://www.websterlakeassociation.org)). Additional, booster treatments will occur as needed in June and July, but no other restrictions other than those noted above will be required. Printed signs, warning of these and any other water use restrictions will be posted around the affected areas in advance of treatment. The work is being performed under a License to Apply Chemicals permit issued from MA DEP and an Order of Conditions from the Webster Conservation Commission. SOLitude Lake Management of Shrewsbury, MA will be performing this work for the Webster Lake Association.
